A Letter from Pastor Jayme



This past month, we've been talking about courage — not the kind that roars or postures, but the kind that moves faithfully into what God is calling us to do next. We've followed Zacchaeus as he climbed down from hiding, Joshua as he stepped up to lead, Daniel as he knelt to pray, and Solomon as he rose to build. And over and over, we've heard that same heartbeat of Scripture:

"Be strong and courageous, and do it."

Courage is not the absence of fear — it's faith in motion. It's believing that God's presence is greater than our uncertainty. And this month, church, *you've done just that*.

You've been courageous.

On October 18th, Bondurant Christian Church hosted a table at the **Bondu-Spooktacular** — something we've never done before. You handed out candy, pressed temporary tattoos onto tiny arms, laughed with families, and shared smiles and invitations with hundreds of people in our community. You didn't just show up; you showed courage. You stepped out from behind the safety of the sanctuary walls and met people where they are — in their costumes, on their streets, in their joy.

And we're not stopping there. On **October 29th**, we'll once again meet our community **right outside our church building** for the **Business Safe Trick-or-Treat** event. We'll set up outside, hand out candy, and welcome families — sharing warmth, laughter, and a reminder that God's love lives not only inside these walls, but out on the streets of Bondurant, too. These aren't small things. These are courageous steps of hospitality and hope — and each one is a stone in the house God is building through us.

But courage hasn't just been collective — it's been personal, too.

This month, one of our own members, Kristy Van Der Molen, stepped forward with holy boldness to ask a beautiful question:

"What can we do to minister to women and families who have experienced infertility, infant loss, and miscarriage?"

That's what courageous prayer looks like — asking God to turn pain into purpose, grief into grace, and compassion into community. Kristy's leadership reminds us that courage doesn't always stand on a stage; sometimes it begins with one person's willingness to say, "God, use me."

Church, these are not isolated events — they are the signs of a congregation rediscovering its heart. The Spirit is moving. God is stretching us, calling us beyond comfort and into calling, beyond maintenance and into mission.

As we move toward our annual meeting in November, I want us to keep asking the guestion:

Where is God calling me to be strong and courageous — and do it?

Because the courage to build the church is not just for leaders or committees; it's for each one of us. Every gift matters. Every person is needed. Every act of courage builds the house of God in our midst.

This is who we are becoming — a courageous church, alive in faith, willing to risk for the sake of love, and bold enough to believe that God will use us to bless Bondurant.

So be strong and courageous, church — and do it. God is with us. And God is not finished building yet.




Advent Book Study featuring The Christmas Letters

Christmas for Hope Ministries Children

October 19th was an exciting day at BCC! The Missions Team kicked off Christmas for the Hope Ministries children. With their new facility, Hope Ministries Center for Women & Children is able to now house 100 women and children instead of the 30 in past years. Leslie Green, our contact, has asked us to shop for 35 children ranging in age from newborn to age 10+. Now that they have extra space, the need to accept more women and children is there and the numbers are growing. I am excited to report, that all 35 children are chosen! To everyone who has chosen a child/children for this wonderful Christmas project, THANK YOU!!! Because of your kindness and generosity, children currently residing at Hope Ministries will have special presents to open Christmas morning.

Because there were so many details shared on Sunday, October 19th, following are some important items to note as you shop:

All gifts, stocking stuffers and giftwrap/bows/gift bags are due back to church no later than Sunday, November 16th, as the Missions Team will deliver them to Hope Ministries November 17th.

- **How much to spend?** Ultimately, it is up to you to decide. However, Hope Ministries is suggesting \$20-\$30 per child for their Christmas gift(s). They suggest one to two gifts.
- <u>IMPORTANT! ... Be sure to "staple" the ornament to the outside of the bag</u> containing the gift(s) when you bring to church. This will be most helpful to Hope Ministries as well as the Missions Team as we are checking off gifts that have been returned to the church.
- Also be sure to sign off on the sign-up sheets when your gift(s) have been purchased/returned to church so we know what has been returned.
- Do not wrap gifts as moms will choose what their kids will receive and personally wrap them closer to Christmas.
- Do not choose gifts that are violent in nature or have weapons. Many children have come from a violent experience, and Hope Ministries wants to only expose them to positive experiences as they help them heal.
- In the past, we have placed gifts in Christmas gift bags. It's not necessary to do so this year; but if you do, the gift bag will be used and appreciated.

A very thoughtful church member has graciously purchased 35 Christmas stockings for the children. Thank you!!! They were a big hit last year, so we are doing it again this year. So exciting!!! Now we need stocking stuffers!!! Stocking stuffers can be very inexpensive items purchased at the Dollar stores, Wal-Mart, Target or wherever you choose to shop. Suggested stocking stuffers are for children newborn to age 10+ and could include:

- ⇒ Candy (soft chewable preferred)
- ⇒ Nail polish
- ⇒ Socks
- ⇒ Crayons or markers
- ⇒ Bookmarks, books, and activity books
- ⇒ Card games
- ⇒ Anything else you see or think of that is fun for children newborn to age 10+.
- There are 2 boxes labeled "Stocking Stuffers" near the bulletin board for you to place stocking stuffers that will include candy. he bigger the variety, the more fun kids will enjoy.
- Wrapping paper, gift bags and bows are always welcome. A rectangle box is in front of the bulletin board labeled "GIFT WRAP...BOWS...GIFT BAGS" just waiting for your offering.
- There is signage on a back pew of the church designated for gifts as they are returned. Please allow us to utilize the pew for a few weeks to corral gifts as they arrive.

Preschool Annual Report

Our 2024/25 school year was nothing short of a success. We ended the year with an enrollment percentage of 100%, rising from 96% in 2023/24. The school welcomed me with open arms as the new director in October of 2024. Both 3-year-old teachers from the previous year remained the same. We said goodbye to **our** 4-year-old lead, Katie, and welcomed Mrs. Lightwine in January. After my first full year as director, I have been learning and loving how to do everything well and properly!

Our monthly events remained successful throughout the year and are a parent favorite, and I firmly believe, one of the many reasons why families choose BCCP. These events continue to include Muffins with Mom, Donuts with Dad, Christmas Programs, Valentine's Day with Mom, Dr. Seuss Day with Dad, Grandparents Day, and our Spring Program/Graduation. Again, these events were all incredibly popular and appreciated by many. In order to provide adequate invitations and notifications for these events, I released dates and times with their enrollment at the beginning of the school year, versus planning them as the year went on. This gave parents, guests, and grandparents plenty of time to plan for their schedules at work and at home. We will continue with these events as they are not only important to our preschoolers but also set us apart from the standard. We feel that the standard that we maintain will set us apart from other preschool settings, not only through these events but as we incorporate prayer, small devotionals, and God's expectations and creations in each. day.

In May, we received a grant of \$1,500 to get new manipulatives and outdoor toys, along with carpet squares in the four-year-old room, instead of the rug that was just not fitting our needs anymore. My favorite thing we were about to get with this grant is a story box that the children have loved sitting in the book center and listening to.

Our social media presence continues to grow, and we also maintain our private parents' page. The parent feedback has been nothing short of positive and encouraging. Teachers do their best to photograph each day and post peeks into the classroom. This was also a great tool to set reminders. We are currently operating without a website, but I am making strides to get this rebuilt and functioning before 2026-27 registration.

It remains to be our hope and prayer that through this preschool ministry, we can draw more families into the church building itself and also help build the foundation **and** familiarity of faith in their little hearts before sending them off to their Kindergarten year.
